- Flann Lynch is an Irish Capuchin who has spent much of his working life ministering in New Zealand. He is now based in Kilkenny and promotes the Vision Seminar.



- Michael Drumm is Chairperson of the recently established Catholic Schools Partnership. This new body will provide support for all the partners in Catholic Schools in a changing Ireland. Previously a lecturer in theology and Director of Mater Dei Institute in Dublin he has published numerous books and articles on the role of faith in Irish society.

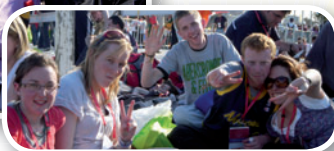
